



PE and Sports Premium

Morley Place Academy has a curriculum that develops, motivates and enthuses each child to develop their full potential. We are committed to developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people.

The sports funding premium is a government initiative that targets extra money to all pupils and all schools. The government are not dictating how schools should spend this money, but are clear that schools will need to employ the strategies that they know will support these pupils to increase their active participation in sports. Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

2015-16

During the last financial year, Morley Place Academy spent the majority of the money it received on acquiring professional sports coaches to school to enhance the PE curriculum. This led to a big improvement in the quality of PE lessons. More lessons are now graded good or outstanding than before.

Money was also spent on developing teacher's confidence in teaching PE through staff training, PE Coordinator training and the purchase of a whole school Scheme of Work. This helped teachers deliver high quality PE lessons pitched at developing the whole child.

We also focused on developing the role of Sports Leaders. These pupils were responsible in setting up activities at playtime and encouraged children to take part in different sporting activities. These sessions proved very successful with more children active at lunchtimes. Midday Supervisors were also trained to deliver sporting activities, which also helped further develop relationships between pupils and staff.

The amount of children who took part in after school clubs across the Key Stage increased last year. 52% of children took part in an enrichment activity last year compared to 35% the previous year. These clubs were often set up to deliver high quality training in preparation for local sports competitions.

Last year, our school competed in lots of different tournaments and had success at athletics, football, rounders and hockey. Children with 100% attendance were also rewarded with a fantastic day out at the Sheffield Institute of Sport.

2016-17

This financial year, Morley Place Academy has received £9000. Listed below are our intentions of how we are going to spend the money along with our proposed outcomes.

- Whole school PPA cover in the form of trained sports coaches that can deliver specific sports, so pupils receive high quality provision, often in preparation for local tournaments
- Further development of the Y6 Sports Leader role. The leaders will be responsible for promoting new sporting activities at lunchtime and encouraging children to participate in more sporting activities than they would have done previously. Some of these new activities will be games that the children might have recently seen at the recent Rio Olympics, such as handball
- Sports coaches and Sports Leaders will train Y5 children in school, in a paired buddy system, so that they can become young sports leaders. They will then be able to organise and run sessions and activities at lunchtimes, developing their own leadership skills
- Increased participation in inter-school competitions to provide opportunities to apply skills learnt at the academy
- After school coaching sessions to maintain engagement in a variety of sports and allow children to try new activities/sports, stay fit and healthy and have fun
- Additional opportunities for children to take part in outdoor and adventurous activity challenges both individually and within a team. This will develop the children's ability to be more resilient learners both inside and outside the classroom
- Continue the offer to pupils of subsidised weekly holiday clubs each half term. *This programme is also available to pupils in the local area who attend our infant and secondary schools*
- Purchase of necessary PE equipment/resources to teach the new curriculum
- Set up of daily Breakfast Club to offer children a healthy breakfast and a sporting activity to start the day
- Subsidise transport for local competitions and tournaments. This ensure more children are able to access competitions

Our use of this funding will be monitored throughout the year to ensure maximum impact and enable our pupils to receive high quality PE and Games. Impact will be measured against the proposed outcomes, the increased percentage of pupils receiving high quality provision and the increased number of pupils taking part in a range of enrichment activities.
